

I Can Only Imagine

This true story follows the life of Bart Millard, lead singer of the Christian band MercyMe, who loses his father to cancer and inspires him to write the mega-hit song, I Can Only Imagine.



Almost 15 years ago while serving my previous church I preached through the book of Ecclesiastes. It surprised me then how profound the message was for today's world. Most people know little about the book aside from the Byrd's classic song "Turn, Turn, Turn" and the reference to the nature of life in chapter 3. Recently I found myself reading back through this unique and challenging book. I even commented on a portion of it in an article a few months back. Solomon (calling himself the Preacher) works his way through the ways in which he attempted to find meaning in life – money, work, leisure, sex, relationships, and even hobbies. His conclusion on the matter is that all of these things, if pursued as an end in and of themselves is vanity. He concludes his argument in 12:8 by saying, "'Vanity of vanities,' says the Preacher, 'All is vanity.'" Not a book for the faint of heart!

Many see Solomon's words as nothing but broken cynicism, the grumpy ramblings of an old man who feels like he wasted his life. But this is not Solomon's point. Life is full of vanity when the trappings of life are pursued as our greatest purpose and end. If we insist on giving ourselves to the things that are "under the sun" (a common phrase in the book) then we will never be satisfied with it. Many of the experiences Solomon pursued were fine pursuits, intended by God to be enjoyed. But these experiences and goals and desires are not to be the purpose of our lives. They can only be rightly enjoyed when pursued in the right context and in the right way.

What is that context? Solomon's summation is simple. "Fear God and keep His commandments, for this is man's all (12.13)." To me such bold and simple words are striking. Life's really not that

To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven.
Ecclesiastes 3:1

complicated, at least on one level. To fear God is to be rightly related to Him. We know this happens only through the redeeming work of Jesus Christ. To keep His commandments is to live as we've been created to live in Christ. In fact, the New Testament indicates that our obedience is a means by which we express our love for God. The entirety of life's purpose is found only when we filter every facet of life through knowing and loving God. We should work hard, we should enjoy life, we should have meaningful relationships, and we should

have hobbies. These, however, are not life's aim. This is Solomon's point.

We must fight against the current of the culture that encourages people to follow their hearts and pursue their dreams. The whole "follow your heart" mantra is really just a way to say, "you can be really famous and popular and wealthy and therefore enjoy life." It is the essence of being self-centered. In reality the voices of this age which encourage the pursuit of ones dreams are actually encouraging the very thing Solomon warns us about in this book. How many voices do we hear telling us that money, fame, power, sex, and other forms of pleasure make life meaningful? To pursue such a path will only end in disappointment. Instead, let's evaluate our lives with Solomon's simple words. Do we fear God and do we keep His commandments? I encourage you to take some time and read through Solomon's last words. It's not an easy read but God will use it to continue to fashion you into the image of Christ.


Starting Sunday night, July 1, we will kick off our Sunday night children’s program:

Adam Willard and family will be moving to Kampala, Uganda in August, quite a way from where they currently live. Once settled in, they will fulfill their new role as Interim Unit Leaders for the more than 48 AIM (African Inland Missions) missionaries in Uganda. In last month's letter, I shared with you that we were seeking housing and a vehicle for the Wallers while they are home on furlough from September thru the first of March/2019. I am happy to say that God has provided their needs and they have a home to stay in while in the Fairmont area or here in New Bern, while visiting both families. A vehicle has also been provided. We are in the process of collecting items to furnish the house they will stay in (they will be staying in the parsonage in Pollocksville) If you have any kitchen, bath, furniture or other items we can use to stock the house while they are here let me know (you will get the items back if you choose). In June, there was a team of 18 teens from the Rocky Mount area who visited Bulgaria to help with outdoor gospel projects, English nights and other activities. While the rain may have dampened their plans on many occasions, their spirits were not and many gospel seeds were sown. Please continue to pray for the Bulgarian people who need to know Jesus!

Thank-you so much to our church family for continuing to support our missionaries through your prayers, financial support and in all the many ways you help when there is a need! Your encouragement to all of them means so much and is a vital part of ensuring their success on the field. God Bless You All. The latest message is that their arrival may be August 25th !

Every Sunday school class needs to be prepared to make a great first impression. If you expect new people every week, what are some things you will do BEFORE, DURING, and AFTER they visit?

Before they visit, consider who's saying "Hello" when they come? Often times only the teacher says "Hello". Let me encourage you to have someone besides the teacher say hello. Have the class introduce themselves and then someone to introduce the guest(s) to the other class members, and invites the guest(s) to sit with them during the Worship service.

During their visit, smile and show your teeth! Welcome everyone! Ask them if they want to enroll (belong to your class).

The real test of a friendly class comes after the benediction. Be friendly to each other and express care about each other.

The guests are watching. Offer to help them find where the preschool and children's classes are. Shake hands while exiting. Make them feel welcome to your class and our church.

After the visit, follow UP! Send a text, an email, write a letter, make a phone call, meet them for coffee or dinner, and even go visit!

What Happens at Preschool...Stays at Preschool??

Not if we are doing our job correctly! We strive to make each preschool day so much fun and memorable, that children want to talk about it at home and relive it over and over. Our goal is to give children a strong foundation for learning, a love for learning, and a positive view of school, that will carry over when they outgrow preschool.

So what happens during a preschool morning?

Weekly Themes

All our classes do the same themes each week, but on their own developmental level. The teachers weave the theme throughout all activities of the day and incorporate it in each Learning Center.

Snack Time

We love to eat! Whether it's something a parent has sent in to share with the class, or it's something the class has made or baked together, snack time is always a hit!

Pennies to Pesos

We collect money all year for two adopted missionary families—the Millars in Mexico and the Willards in Africa. Children learn the joy of giving and we celebrate each penny that a child brings!

Bible Stories

We have a Bible story and scripture verse that coincide with each theme and we tie it in with all the day's activities, during circle time and teachable moments throughout the morning.

Chapel Time

All our classes come together in the sanctuary where we learn more about our Bible story and worship God through scripture, song and prayer.

Shutterfly Book

Our teachers create an individual photo book for each child that is filled with pictures we have taken all year long! It's a great way to capture the year for parents who are not in the classroom to witness every smile, laugh, budding friendship and moment of wonder that we are blessed to be part of.

Circle Time

The class comes together on the carpet and they learn through songs, books, flannel boards, games, etc.

Craft Time

“The messier and more involved, the better” often seems to be the theme of our craft time! Sometimes our crafts are product oriented – they are making something specific that goes with the theme; and other times they are process oriented – it's more about the “how” and not the “what”.

Outside Play

We go outside every day, but if the weather doesn't cooperate we head to the gym. Developing gross motor skills is an important part of each child's day!

Center Time

Children learn through play, so each day they have the opportunity to explore and play in the different learning centers such as Home-living/Dramatic Play, Blocks, Puzzles & Manipulatives, Books, Writing, Science & Nature, Art and Music.

Small Group Time

While the children are in center time, the teachers will gather 2 or 3 children at a time for a fun learning project or game.

And then some other stuff happens... story time at the public library; field trips such as the farm, pet store and aquarium; family events such as fall cookout, dinner with dad/mom; Christmas and End of Year Programs; Lunch Bunch; Early Risers; and the list goes on and on...

And in all that we do, it is our prayer that each child will “...grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.”(2 Peter 3:18) Our new preschool year will be starting in September – we'd love for your preschooler to join us!





Monthly Amount \$86,335**




